Many people do not understand why they struggle with sexual and/or gender identity disorder. Though the suicide rate is extremely high, the psychiatric and medical community urges these emotionally wounded people to find their cure in unnecessary, invasive and mutilating surgery; all in the vain attempt to find inward peace and wholeness.

CONSIDER THIS.. Gender Identity Confusion begins in the lives of young children. In 2004, the Los Angeles chapter of Gay, Lesbian & Straight Education Network produced a book called "What's with the Dress Jack?" This is a method to introduce into young children's minds the normalcy of cross-dressing. Is this what we want our young people to be taught in school? The younger generation has been forced with confusion messages that are held in our school systems and in society.

Definitions and Terms

HOMOSEXUAL

One who is attracted to a member of the same gender in erotic, physical and emotional ways. This person is trying to connect with a member of the same sex in order to feel complete and fulfilled. The most credible research indicates that this is not a genetic malady at all, but rather a result of unresolved childhood emotional wounds.

TRANSSEXUAL

One who feels they need to be a member of the opposite sex. They feel uncomfortable in their God-given gender role and out of place in society due to the incongruity between their real and perceived sex. They will often resort to the ingestion of hormones of the opposite sex and undergo extensive mutilating surgery in order to finally feel good about themselves.

CROSSDRESSER/TRANVESTITE

This is the person who likes to dress as a member of the opposite sex in order to achieve a sexual high and temporary "feel-good." This person is not one who wants to live full-time in the role of the opposite sex. It is far more prevalent in men than women.

DRAG QUEEN

One who dresses and emulates women in order to get men's attention. They don't desire sex change.

Denise's Personal Story

When I was 10 years old, my dad shared with me that he was a cross-dresser. My dad expressed how he wished he were like me, a girl. This had a tremendous impact on my life. I was not comfortable being a girl growing up around my dad. As a child, I would observe his actions trying to look for a hint of what he might be feeling.

Years later my dad left our family to pursue the life of a transsexual. He thought this would fill him with

happiness and peace about himself. I didn't even recognize my own dad. Thirteen years after he had left our family we received news about his illness and impending death. God brought his own forgiveness and grace to all of us before my father's death. Sadly, my dad revealed, just a day prior to his passing, how he would not have lived this kind of life-choice again, if he were given another chance.

God's forgiveness and grace enabled me to face what I later learned from my father's personal belongings including some letters that exposed another aspect of his secret life concerning his homosexual relationships while living in the assumed role of a woman. His search to find fulfillment and personal completion left him empty all of his life.
